

Valencian Fallas:

This festival was declared to be an Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity by UNESCO.

Las Fallas' are traditional festivities originating from the province of Valencia, combining tradition, satire and art. From the 14th to the 19th of March, Valencia will transform into a city full of life and color.

Fallas originates from an ancient custom of the region's carpenters, who would burn their leftover wooden shavings on the night of March 19th. This practice was done so to not only clean and purify their workshops, but also to celebrate the arrival of spring. Hence why the festivities are held in honour of St. Joseph, the patron saint of carpenters.

Over the years, an element of customisation and personal touch was added to this tradition, resulting in today's transformation into works of art. This traditional festival is characterised by the construction and installation of large ephemeral monuments in the streets of the city, these monuments are formed by "ninots", dolls and personalised objects made of papier-mache that, through satire, art and imagination represent everyday situations of life and society.

During the festivities there are numerous events, bands, and parades throughout the streets, with locals wearing traditional "fallero" costumes. The public enjoys the outdoor food stalls and numerous fireworks are set off. A queen of the festival is elected, called the "Fallera Mayor", and takes on the responsibility of promoting the festival for a year.

'Las Fallas' fosters collective creativity and the safeguarding of traditional arts and crafts. They contribute to the creation and maintenance of the community and the forging of its cultural identity, the promotion of the Valencian language and its social cohesion. That is why in 2016 The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) declared the Fallas festivities of Valencia to be an Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity.

Las Fallas' from the point of view of community resilience and sustainable development through the social economy:

- The Fallas are non-profit associations.
- They are compatible with human rights. They are open and inclusive towards any social group, regardless of age and profession. The transmission of this tradition fosters social cohesion.
- They add value to the heritage of other fire festivals. The creativity of their arts allows the continuity of the crafts involved.
- The use of satire is an important source of inspiration in the contemporary world.
- The intergenerational transmission is ensured thanks to the work of the Fallas Commissions and the participation of the administrations.
- The Fallas are supported by numerous diverse parties: the local community, the local, regional and autonomous government and the universities.
- They advance and strengthen the Valencian economy.
- They promote tourism in Valencia and Spain.
- Preservation and generational transmission of traditional jobs and creation of new jobs.
- Increasing participation and representation of women.
- Through monuments, social tradition can be expressed and disseminated.
- It can be an effective channel for the diffusion of Valencian culture and language.
- It raises awareness, and disseminates social messages and information in different areas through books and courses within the association: equality, first aid, recycling, self-defense, etc.
- Sharing of local gastronomy.
- They organise visits, excursions and various talks on different topics throughout the year.
- As an organisation, they are in charge of collecting food, products, etc. for charitable purposes to help both within the community and in other countries.
- Continuous support in social events.
- Interaction and collaboration among the different agents of society.
- In 2012 they were included by the autonomous government in the General Inventory of Valencian Cultural Heritage and later in the Register of Assets of Cultural Interest of the Ministery.
